









Papular urticaria is a common allergic reaction to insect bites, particularly from mosquitoes, fleas, and ticks. It is characterized by small, red, raised lesions (papules) on the skin. The lesions are often itchy and can be painful. Papular urticaria is most common in children and young adults. It is usually self-limiting and resolves within a few weeks. Treatment is usually symptomatic, with antihistamines and topical corticosteroids used to relieve itching and inflammation.
