



Linear Epidermal Nevus

Linear epidermal nevi, or verrucous nevi, may be either localized or systematized.

In the *localized type*, which is present usually ~~but not invariably~~ at birth, only a

In the *systematized type*, papillomatous hyperkeratosis is seen in a linear isomeric

Localized and, more commonly, systematized linear epidermal nevi may be associated with skeletal def

The presence of a basal cell epithelioma within a linear epidermal nevus has been observed occasionally.

Histopathology .
